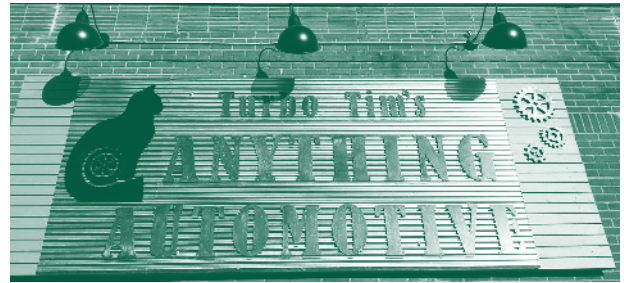

They relocated from their 23rd & Jackson site to 2823 Central because their business was growing and they needed more space.

Already a NE business, moving to Audubon Park seemed like a more perfect fit since the couple also owns a house in Audubon Park.

Rachel said her husband, Turbo Tim Suggs, has always been interested in cars.

"He's very passionate," Rachel said. "When he's not working on other people's cars, he's got his own project cars just for him." She said when he was a child his mother used to take him to the library and he would always check out car owner's manuals. If that doesn't describe passion nothing does.

For years Turbo Tim's has always participated in Art-A-Whirl but in a slightly unusual way.

This year is no exception. Turbo Tim's will hold its grand opening during Art-A-Whirl weekend on May 15-17 with most of the events occurring on Saturday, May 16. And it promises to be quite the celebration!

To encourage good design in residential remodeling, the Audubon Park Neighborhood, in partnership with the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Minnesota, is helping to cover the cost of two hours of architectural services. The AIA is the professional organization of architects in Minnesota. AIA architects are licensed and required to take continuing education courses to keep current with laws, codes, and new materials.

What is a raingarden?

A raingarden is a shallow depression in the ground that is designed to capture rainwater and allow it to soak into the ground within 48 hours. Raingardens are best designed with plants that are well adapted to the unique conditions of the garden and your region (such as local native plants).



Whether you are an experienced gardener or have never tried gardening before, this eco-friendly workshop will help you learn how to:

- Keep our water clean with native plants, raingardens, and shoreline plantings
- Create pollinator habitat by using beautiful native plants in your landscape
- Redirect your downspouts and install a rain barrel
- Design your landscape with one-on-one assistance from landscape designers and Hennepin County Master Gardeners
- Adopt healthy yard care practices to improve our land and water habitat

Fast Facts about runoff and native plants:

- Every time it rains one inch, an average urban residential property sheds about 5,400 gallons of stormwater runoff.
- The EPA defines stormwater runoff as the number one threat to water quality in our lakes and streams.
- As pollinators around the country experience threats from loss of habitat and pesticides they are unable to sustain the native plants that filter stormwater, hold soil in place, and keep our waterways clean.

Metro Blooms, a local non-profit organization, works to strengthen communities by promoting environmentally-sound landscaping that beautifies neighborhoods and protects our environment. Northeast Community Education Update

Sports/Arts+ Summer Program Gets a Facelift

The summer program traditionally known as the Sports/Arts+ program at Waite Park for more than 25 years is now getting a facelift.

The program sponsored by Minneapolis Community Education will be held at Northeast Middle School this summer. Waite Park is the host site for summer school and there was no space available. The new program, Waite Park Summer Explorers, will run from June 15-July 30 for students entering grades 1-8. Activities include arts & crafts, biking, cooking, drama, fitness, science, swimming and technology. Breakfast and lunch, or lunch and a snack will be provided free of charge.

Cost of the program:

M-Th mornings, 9-10:30, weekly cost \$35.
M- Th mornings, 10:35-12:05, weekly cost \$35
M-Th mornings, 9-12, weekly cost \$70
M-F afternoons, 12:30-4, \$400 resident and \$500 non-resident.

Payments may be made all at once, or on a payment schedule. This can be set up on an individual basis. Limited partial scholarships are available.

ANA, NEMS Receive Planning Grant by Nic Baker

On March 12, the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization (MWMO) announced award of a \$9,640 grant in response to a joint application from Audubon Neighborhood Association (ANA), Northeast Middle School (NEMS), and the Minneapolis School Board. ANA is contributing \$2000 of its own funds to the project.

The purpose of the project is to study the NEMS property adjoining 29th Avenue to determine if efforts can be made to reduce runoff. A secondary purpose is to generally beautify the area, which is much in need of beautification.



ANA will contract with a consulting firm to do the actual study. The study will include participation of the NEMS students. The educational value of the project may have been a major factor in winning the grant.

A similar project has taken place at Edison High School, also with significant MWMO funding. However, this project is of a much larger scale than that envisioned for NEMS.

Once completed, the study will determine whether significant reductions in runoff can be achieved in that area. If so – which is likely – ANA and NEMS will apply for an Action Grant from MWMO. These grants, with a maximum of \$50,000, help fund the approved projects.



ANA Board Treasurer Don Sellers is co-project manager, along with Mark Bollinger, Facilities Manager of the School Board. NEMS principal Ben Perry and ANA board members Sonja Peterson, Nic Baker, and Egan Haugesag have also been involved in the planning and will continue to support the project.

ANA Strategic Planning Survey

The ANA Strategic Planning Survey process is now complete. Thank you to those who participated and took the time to give your feedback. If you were unable to participate, we would still like to hear your thoughts. You can contact the ANA office though email, phone, postal mail, or Facebook.

ANA received a total of 171 survey responses (both online and hard copies), which amounts to 7.7% of the households in the neighborhood. The survey participants represented a majority of the following demographics (in no particular order)—white females, residents, homeowners, people without children, median income of \$50,000-74,999. People of color make up approximately 20% of Audubon residents but only account for 6% of respondents. This shows that one area of opportunity for ANA is outreach to under-represented groups in our neighborhood, with people of color being one of those groups.

ANA worked with a consultant to develop the survey and compile the results. Five goals came out of the final report—outreach and engagement (specifically toward the following groups: people of color, low-income residents, renters, and people who speak a language other than English as their primary language); increase access to current programming; review and grow programming offered by ANA (including farmer's market, loan programs, and others); support for businesses (we're currently looking at what types of programs would benefit the business community in the neighborhood); and addressing place-based issues (this could include safety, beautification, schools, traffic calming, and accessing City processes).

Those who responded to the survey (and included their address) are eligible for the following prizes: (1) \$100 gift certificate to Eastside Food Coop or (25) \$50 toward their National Night Out block party. Winners will be notified during the month of May.

Complete survey answers will be available in the ANA office and more information will be sent out as we develop a process to implement the feedback gathered from the surveys.
